Proposal

A Zoning By-Law Amendment application to permit a mixed-use building with two towers, 35 and 50 storeys in height, connected by a 11-storey podium. The existing buildings on the site would be demolished. The proposed development includes 844 rental units (of which 257 will be affordable), a new daycare, and ground level retail. A total of 215 parking spaces and 845 bicycle parking spaces are proposed to support the new development. 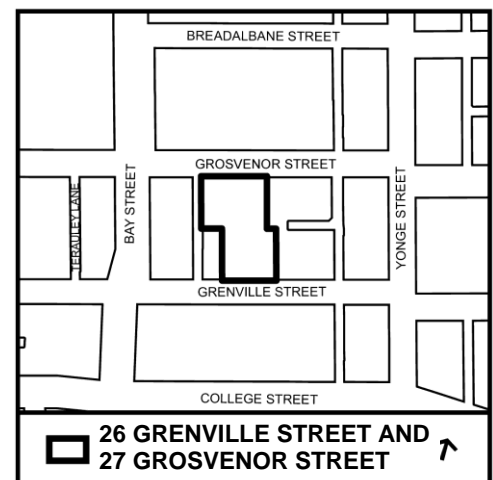
